

The Notification of The Civil Aviation Authority of Thailand
Subject: Acceptance of Foreign Authorised Release Certificates (No. 2), B.E. 2568 (2025)

As per the previous Notification of The Civil Aviation Authority of Thailand on Acceptance of Foreign Authorised Release Certificates B.E.2564 (2021), it has become necessary to revise the Notification to reflect current circumstances. By the authority granted under Section 41/76, paragraph one of the Air Navigation Act B.E. 2497 (1954), as amended by the Civil Aviation Authority of Thailand Emergency Decree B.E. 2558 (2015), the Director General of CAAT hereby issues the following:

Item 1 This notification shall be called "The Notification of the Civil Aviation Authority of Thailand on Acceptance of Foreign Authorised Release Certificates (No. 2), B.E. 2568 (2025)"

Item 2 This Notification shall become effective from the date of announcement (19 September B.E. 2568 (2025))

Item 3 The provision (2) of Clause 4 in the previous notification dated 25 August B.E. 2564 (2021), is repealed and replaced with the following:

"Item (2) For used products (excluding quality-assured parts designed and manufactured under certification processes as specified in (1)(a)(6)), the following foreign certificates are accepted:

(a) EASA Form 1 issued by a foreign repair station certified under EASA Part 145 standard to issue an Authorised Release Certificate under EASA Part 145.A.50 Release to Service condition.

(b) FAA 8130-3 issued by a foreign repair station located in the United States of America and certified by the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA).

(c) TCCA Form One issued by a foreign repair station located in Canada and certified by Transport Canada Civil Aviation (TCCA).

(d) ANAC Form F-100-01 or ANAC form SEGVÔO 003 issued by a foreign repair station located in Brazil and certified by the National Civil Aviation Agency-Brazil.

(e) UK CAA Form 1 issued by a foreign repair station located in the United Kingdom and certified by the Civil Aviation Authority.

In addition, a foreign civil aviation authority in (b), (c), (d) and (e) shall have an EASA bilateral agreement to issue the Authorised Release Certificate under EASA Part 145.A.50 Release to Service condition. Except for TCCA Form One or TCCA 24-0078 in (c) issued after 16 November B.E. 2567 (2024), which comply with Canadian Aviation Regulation (CAR) 571 or 573, or any general aviation aircraft which are not operated in accordance with General Aviation Requirement - Part 2 Large and Turbojet Aeroplane Operations of the Notification of CAAT on General Aviation Operations Requirements B.E. 2568 (2025), the Foreign Authorised Release Certificates mentioned in (a) to (e) are acceptable without EASA Part 145.A.50 Release to Service condition."

English translation – Summary of the Thai Language Notification

Item 4 Clause 5 of the previous Notification of The Civil Aviation Authority of Thailand on Acceptance of Foreign Authorised Release Certificates B.E.2564 (2021)), is repealed and replaced with the following:

“Item 5 Foreign Authorised Release Certificates other than those mentioned in Item 4 for Major Aircraft Appliances, Aircraft Replacement Parts, or TSO Articles which have been installed before the effective date of this Notification, or equipped with foreign aircraft applying for Thai registration, are still valid until the next maintenance check or replacement of those appliances, parts or articles.”
